UPDATE ON THE HURRICANE

The hurricane has moved on.

We have been out of power since Saturday night, although we have some emergency power. I was up around 4:30 AM Sunday mopping water and putting buckets under leaks. The wind was going almost horizontal, so it drove water sideways through transoms and windows that were not absolutely shut tight. And then there were just plain leaks to cope with.

We went from room to room looking for leaks. The teachings here had to stop for lack of electricity, but we did two long pujas, Green Tara and an extended Mahakala practice that was three hours long.

The roads I am told are impassable up and down the mountain due to fallen trees, etc., although they are clearing it out. We have plenty of food and water and this reminds me of our Michigan blizzards when school is called off.

Lots of camaraderie, talk, and discussion. Today (Monday) should be back to normal but we may not have power for some days. Over 90,000 folks are without power in this county alone.

Hope wherever you are, you are well.
